1938 : Kristallnacht when Jewish synagogues, homes, schools and community centres were smashed by the Nazis

1989: when people took power to destroy the Berlin Wall

2003: International Day for the Fall of the Wall & the End of the Israeli Occupation

This 'separation wall' is the barrier being built by Israel as a so-called temporary security measure.

No-one on the ground, including Israeli settlers, thinks it is temporary

After all, Israel is spending the colossal sum of more than \$2 million a kilometre - more than the most expensive motorway in Britain.

It is not being built on Israel's border with the West Bank

It runs deep into Palestinian territory, dividing farmers from their lands; children from their schools; villages from their local towns; appropriating fertile Palestinian farm land and encircling the West Bank. It snakes around most illegal Israeli settlements. Its aim is to strangle any possibility of Palestinian independence.

In some places, around Palestinian towns, it is 8 metres high

- the height of a three storey block and three times higher than the Berlin wall! There are watchtowers every 300 metres. There are military roads on both sides, trenches 6 metres wide and 4 metres deep, barbed wire, electrified fencing, armoured patrols. It is up to 80 metres wide in total.

It violates human rights

The Israeli human rights organization B'tselem, estimates that 210,000 Palestinians are having their human rights violated – and that is only from the building of the North-West section of the wall!

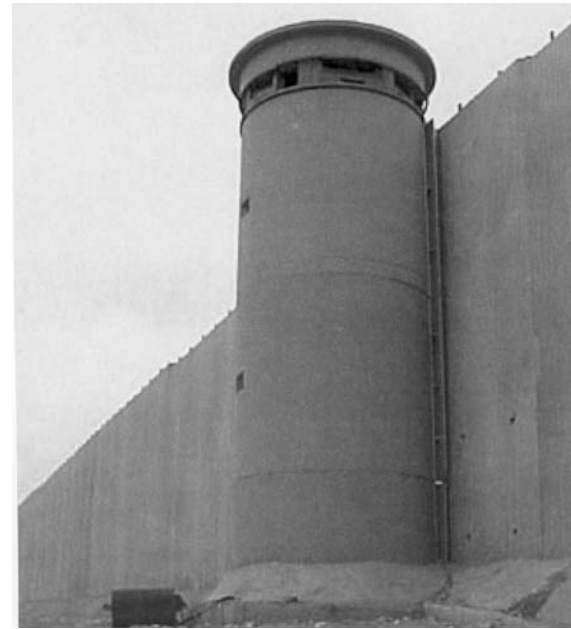
This is not the way to build long-term safety and security for the Israeli people - that requires a just settlement with the Palestinian people and an international peacekeeping force
